MODERATOR NEWS

Visit from Dr. Chittum: I want to update you as to a meeting that took place with Dr. Chittum on Saturday, July 15. Fourteen members from the Trustees, Deacons, and Church council met for approximately two hours with Dr. Chittum. Dr. Chittum is the director of the National Association of Congregational Christian Churches (NACCC). Over the course of the last few years, he has served our church as both a liaison preacher as well as a source of input during this difficult time of transition. The purpose of the meeting was to hear Dr. Chittum's views and suggestions concerning various issues and challenges we are experiencing in our church to help us move forward and "grow" our church.

The issues which were discussed are as follows:

- The declining attendance at our services
- The need for our bylaws to be updated (much work needed!)
- The importance of all members to have a copy of the bylaws
- Reverend Ian's returns to Greenville
- The ongoing emotional struggle some members are experiencing
- Involving the congregation members in decisions concerning the church by hearing positives as well as concerns
- The positive steps our church leaders are implementing to address these issues
- The importance for all members to know and follow our church Covenant
- The importance of forgiveness
- The need for open communication among leadership and the congregation

I feel, as do others, that this meeting was extremely helpful as we are at a "crossroads" and that action is needed sooner than later. We can no longer sit back and watch things happen. As members of our church, every person can make a difference as to the direction that our church goes. We must remember our church covenant, as it provides us the very foundation as to what our purpose is as a church as well as what our purpose should be as individuals serving god. Many good conversations came about during the meeting as various members from the committees openly shared concerns, idea, and experiences. In our challenge to move forward, I believe it is vital that communication lines remain open and that transparency exists between leadership and the congregation. I feel we are moving in the right direction, and am hopeful that through forgiveness, prayer, and love, our church will grow once again and be a place where God's message is heard by many. Church Bylaws Amendment: A proposal to amend Article 3, Section D9 for the church bylaws will be voted on Sunday, august 20th following the service. As the bylaws state, only members of the church will be allowed to cast a vote.

The current bylaw states, "The Church Council shall consist of the present Moderator, who shall be the chairperson, Vice Moderator, immediate Past Moderator, Chairperson of the Diaconate, chairperson of the Trustees, one other Deacon and one other Trustee, and the Senior Pastor."

The proposed amendment seeks to add the church Clerk, and a representative from the Pastoral Relations Committee, to the Church Council. At council meetings, the clerk's role is to take notes. The Pastoral Relations committee representative will serve as a source of information between the congregation and the church leaders as it relates to our pastor.
