We have chosen to do a prayer themed cantata this year instead of an Easter one because of the way the calendar works out with school vacations coinciding with Palm Sunday and then followed by Easter. We found the perfect cantata musical to do!

"*Our Father*" by Pepper Choplin --It is rare to find a major, non-seasonal musical with such power and meaning. Choplin has taken *The Lord's Prayer* and shaped it as the foundation of this creative worship experience. With original music and thoughtful narration, the most beloved passages are turned into a musical presentation with teaching moments for the choir and congregation. This musical delivers both artistry and ministry.

It is a beautifully written work - thoughtful and insightful. Pepper wrote a song around each statement in the Lord's Prayer. We will never say that prayer the same way again. It is a deeply meaningful piece!

Ask any church or choir member what anthem or hymn they sang on a particular Sunday a year ago and they're likely to scratch their head and draw a blank. But ask them what musical they did when they were in the adult choir last year and they'll rattle off the title immediately. Again, I'm not saying the weekly anthem isn't the choir's bread and butter, but this is further evidence cantatas are worth it, so COME JOIN US!
