#### The Good News...

On October 31, 1517, Martin Luther nailed his 95 Theses to the door of the castle church in Wittenberg, Germany. These were 95 arguments or topics of debate that he wished to bring to the table and is considered the start of the Reformation. It is an act; one of many acts, that set into motion the birth of the Protestant Church in all her forms. Although Congregationalists generally trace their roots back through the Church of England rather than the German church, we are also children of the Reformation and many of its ideals and beliefs. I hope that you'll find some time to engage together in this; whether you're joyfully down the path, healing toward loving your church again, or somewhere in between, I sense that this will be a wonderfully healing and unifying effort. Combined with our personal visits, our striving to listen better, and our discipline of love and mercy for one another I have great hopes.

Preparations for Advent and Christmas are under way, as we look forward to a beautiful season of light and hope. Our country may still be struggling through divisions and fears, but it seems that our congregation is enjoying some peace and hope and I am excited for the celebrations ahead. What is your favorite part of the Advent & Christmas seasons here at First Congregational of Greenville? Maybe your heart draws toward the season of thankfulness & gratitude and our Pilgrim heritage we celebrate at Thanksgiving? Perhaps it's the joy and costumes of Halloween that inspires you? Let's celebrate together!
