I'll dine with you in your alcohol free home, and I'll dine with the ones you least would in a bar.

In any case, I am a peacemaker and a healer, an idealist visionary and a counselor.

I am, whether it be easy or hard, a pastor.

COUNCIL News — Congregational Vote

There will be a vote after service on Dec. 8th, regarding the two new proposed Amendments to the Bylaws: **1. Gender Inclusive Pronouns throughout the Bylaws** – adding: 'Wherever gender specific pronouns are used in the Bylaws in reference to a member, a leader, or a staff member, they shall be amended to be inclusive of both male and female terms (i.e., he=he/she, his=his/her(s), etc.) Note: there are at least eight (8) instances needing such correction scattered throughout the full document.' and **2. Article VII, Section D: Voting** – adding: 'In the event a church member is not able to attend a meeting, that member may vote by either absentee ballot or by proxy, as outlines in the Standard Operation Procedures.'
