A note from your Parish Nurse: Thank you to all who took the necessary steps to keep our church family safe during the past 15 months of the COVID pandemic! We have had no reported cases of COVID coming from our church services or our preschool which is such a blessing. While it is so nice to see the faces of our family and get back to our normal church activities please be aware that the pandemic is not over. Unfortunately the Delta variant of the virus is in our state and is much more contagious and causes much more serious illness than the previous strains. Symptoms are different for this strain. They begin with headaches, sore throats, runny noses and later fever. These symptoms can easily be confused with allergies or colds especially in children who are very susceptible. Fortunately if you have been fully vaccinated you are highly protected from contracting or passing on this variant. Anyone who has not been vaccinated (including children under 12) must be aware of the contagiousness and seriousness of this virus and take precautions. If you haven't been vaccinated yet please do as soon as possible to protect not only yourself but the children you come in contact with as well as those with weakened immune systems. If you or your children don't feel well please stay home; if you have the symptoms please get tested. There are treatments available and you will save lives by guarantining. COVID is not like the flu, it often has serious long-term consequences. If you have had COVID once you are not protected from getting it again without the vaccine, especially with the new variant. The vaccines are free, safe, highly effective and available for everyone over 12 years old. If you have any questions please feel free to call me or our local Health Department.
