FCCoG Welcomes our Guest Speakers Tom and Wendy Van Tassell!



The church will be kicking off its worship calendar with the help of some old friends, Tom and Wendy Van Tassell. Proof of "what goes around comes around," Tom Van Tassell, with his guitar, originally began a career in ministry as the Youth and Education Director at the church in 1977. After seminary on both the east and west coasts and Wendy deciding that the ministry was her calling as well (after two children), the Van Tassells ministered to congregations in Lansing, MI and Spencer, IA. It was from Spencer that they recently retired as co-pastors after a 23-year run and moved back to Holland, MI where they had met as undergrads at Hope College and where their son is now on the faculty.

Tom and Wendy are planning a six-week extended study of the church's Covenant, the document central to the church's purpose and governance.
