## A Message from our Pastor...

We recently celebrated Thanksgiving Day. On that day many gathered together with family and enjoy a traditional Thanksgiving meal. There was turkey, mashed potatoes, gravy, stuffing and many other family favorites. As the families gathered around the table, people started sharing about things they were thankful for. Some members of the family had something to be thankful for. There were others that have a tough time coming up with anything to share. It seems like in this day in age, people struggle to find things to be thankful for.

It seems like every time we turn around there is more bad news about the state of our community, nation and world. As we listen to all that bad news, it can be hard to find those things in our lives that we can give thanks for. It was the same for the early settlers of this country. The state of their world was upside down. They were sick and dying. Nothing seemed to be going their way. Their crops would not grow and what did grow was certainly not bountiful. They were in an extremely bad situation. In the midst of this depressing situation, those settlers realized they had many things to give thanks for. I have to pause here and ask a question. Who were these settlers giving thanks to in the midst of their great struggle?

They were giving thanks to God for all He had provided. William Bradford, the governor of Plymouth Colony, wrote in his journal Of Plymouth Plantation, "Thus they found the Lord to be with them in all their ways, and to bless their outgoings and incomings, for which let His holy name have the praise forever, to all posterity." They were well aware that God had blessed them by His own hand and they praised him for it. They did not praise and give thanks to God because they were overloaded with food and everything was going right for them. They gave thanks because they were able to endure the hard times. Once again God provided for His people of faith. Now I am not so naive to think that every single person in the Plymouth settlement was a deeply religious person who walked daily with God. This I do know, when God blesses His people there is plenty for everyone. We just need to be willing to share the blessing. That is what those early settlers did. Nobody was left out. They all were fed and enjoyed the blessings from God.

The Bible has many examples of God meeting the needs of the people. One I would like to share is in the Gospel of Mark in the 6th chapter. This is the account of Jesus feeding over five thousand people with five loaves and two fish. How in the world do you feed that many people with such a small amount of food? Jesus took the little bit they did have and in verse 41, "Taking the five loaves and the two fish and looking up to heaven, he gave thanks and broke the loaves. Then he gave them to his disciples to distribute to the people. He also divided the two fish among them all." Jesus gave thanks to God for what they had and God blessed everyone there. It all started by giving thanks.

As we gather together during the next few weeks to celebrate Christmas with friends and family, remember that it all starts by giving thanks. The early settlers knew where the blessings came from. The people who were feed with the loaves and fish knew who provide for them. The blessings came from God. Let's not forget that giving thanks to God on Thanksgiving is how the holiday started. If we take the time to think about it, we have many things to thank God from this past year.

#### **PUBLIC HEALTH ADVISORY**

The Michigan Department of Health and Human Services (MDHHS) has announced that Michigan is presently experiencing another wave of infection driven by the Delta variant, which is estimated to be twice as infectious as the original strain of COVID-19. The Delta variant has driven sharp increases in COVID-19 infections among both adults and children. In addition, Michigan is seeing an uptick in cases of other respiratory illnesses, including influenza. MDHHS is advising the following mitigation strategies:

- Wear a mask in all indoor public settings, regardless of vaccination status.
- 2. Get vaccinated against COVID-19. If vaccinated, get a booster shot everyone 18 and older is eligible.
- 3. Get a flu shot. Everyone ages six months and older are recommended to get a flu shot.
- 4. Get tested for COVID-19 if exposed or symptomatic, regardless of vaccination status.
- 5. Avoid holiday travel if not fully vaccinated.
- \* The information above is intended as an aid to our congregation in determining best practices for yourself and your family. It is <u>not</u> any sort of requirement or mandate.
